KAPSOIT-SOSIOT WATER PROJECT SET TO BENEFIT OVER 6,600 PEOPLE IN KERICHO COUNTY

Kapsoit and Sosiot, neighboring towns in Kericho County, have long grappled with severe water supply challenges despite being situated in a fertile agricultural region. Aging and deteriorated infrastructure resulted in unreliable access to clean water, with seasonal shortages becoming especially acute during dry periods. As a result, residents were forced to rely on inadequate and inconsistent water sources that could not sustain the demands of the growing population. These water issues presented significant health risks and disrupted both household and business operations.

To address these problems, the Kapsoit-Sosiot Water Project was launched. Funded by the German Development Bank (KfW) under WaterFund's Urban Project Concept (UPC) 8th Call, the project seeks to benefit 6,600 people with improved water access. With an 8.7km pipeline extension of the distribution network; construction of a 150m³ storage tank; and the installation of 250 No. water meters. These efforts will ensure a reliable water supply and achieve the objective of last-mile connectivity for the low-income residents of Kapsoit and Sosiot.

Speaking during the commissioning, H.E. Dr. Eric Mutai, Governor Kericho County, expressed his gratitude to the development partners especially WaterFund for the continued support in Kericho's water sector. He promised to continue with the partnership with WaterFund to support more water projects in the underserved areas of the County. Representing WaterFund CEO, Mr. Patrick Mula, Senior Programme Assistant, noted that the project would enhance water access in remote areas consequently enhancing its overall impact. Mr. Mula further added that WaterFund was committed to collaborating with the County Government of Kericho and Kericho Water and Sanitation Company (KEWASCO) in implementing ongoing and future water and sanitation projects.

In attendance during the commissioning was Hon. Julius Siele, Member of County Assembly, Waldai Ward, Kericho County, Eng. Kibii Chepkwony, Managing Director, Kericho Water and Sanitation Company, WaterFund staff and the community members.
